

## **MCCPA 8<sup>TH</sup> GENERAL MEETING: THURSDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2015**

Meeting at Giant Community Room. Camp Hill, PA

President Charlie Boyd called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance and began the Round Table Introductions. Charlie then reported that the Minutes from our September meeting were posted on the website for all to read and asked for a motion to approve the Minutes. Treasurers Report: Erin Boyd reported that the total funds amount is \$5,725.89 and referred all to the hard copy report available at information table.

## New Business:

Passed no opposition.
