1. **Call to Order**

President Max Remington called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance and began roundtable introductions.

2. **Approval of Minutes of August 23, 2018**

Max announced the minutes from the August 23, 2018, meeting were posted on the Club website for review and called for their approval.

It was **MOVED** by Bill Schiel, seconded by John Garner and carried that the minutes be approved as presented.

3. **Treasurer's Report**

Jen Gamber presented the Treasurer's Report, hard copies of which were available for all present at the meeting.

4. **Membership Report**

Jen continued with the Membership Report. She stated the club currently has 236 members, including eight that were added at Round Up.

5. **President's Report**

Max reported that since the last meeting, the Club held the Mustang Round Up and Fords show and the Detroit Steel Show. He remarked that the addition of the Star Spangled Banner, the engine start-up and the Hot Wheels competition gave Round Up a nice pacing. Max thanked all who helped with the show. Before the next

meeting, the Club will have held two more MCCPA events, MCCPA goes to Knoebels and the Capitol City Car Wash Cruise In.

Max reminded members to contact him via email or phone. The Contact page on the website goes directly to his email. The members page username is MCCPA^members and the password is PonyFun2016! Additionally, volunteers are still needed to help organize meet ups for shows as well as to take pictures for Facebook and the MCCPA website.

Max next read a nice thank you note from Barry Klunk.

6. Old Business

Max continued with the following updates:

- **2019 MCCPA officers** - Paul Bellis has reached his term limit of four years as per the Bylaws and cannot run for Vice President next year. Max has served two years as President and three years as Vice President. He will be stepping down but will continue to run the website. Members are needed to fill the positions. These roles need to be filled to continue the club. Carlene Warner has agreed to head the nominating committee. These roles need to be filled to continue the club.

In 2019, the Board would like to create a separate membership role. Jennifer is currently holding two roles. The membership role entails keeping track of new members, confirming payment, sending membership information and updating the membership spreadsheet. The 2019 Board may elect to add Membership and Facilities Manager as board positions. Doing so will require a revision to the Bylaws.

- **MCCPA Merchandise** - MCCPA will continue to use Twisted-T as its apparel supplier. The Club has paid a fee to keep the link open all year. MCCPA also has an L.L. Bean direct business account.
- **Mustang Round Up and Fords Show**
 - Max announced there were leftover goodie bags items for free on the table as well as gift cards for NPD, Mustang America, NGK and JTL available to members for half face value.
 - Max noted the show had a much better turnout for spectators, which might have been due to the ads places in the local papers and the car show links put on the internet. For next year, the Club might increase its Facebook presence with individual posts for the basket raffle, Hot Wheels and exhaust competition.

- The Club received payment from all but one trophy sponsor and from all vendors except the food vendors. Also, Family Ford has sent a Club-only deal on a featured Mustang.
- Max asked that members send any improvement ideas for Round Up to him so they can be noted for next year.
- **MCCPA Goes to Knoebels** - The annual Knoebels is scheduled for Sunday, October 7. The park will have a Halloween theme and wrist bracelets will be available. Members will be meeting at Sizzle-N-Chill and leaving for Knoebels at 9:15. Max stated the Club will be going up 81 and asked anyone who want to meet up between Sizzle-N-Chill and Knoebels to let him know.
- **2018 Covered Bridge Cruise** – This year's cruise will be held on Sunday, October 28, 2018. Registration is now open to anyone. Members can sign up on the website or by paper registration form. All 100 slots are expected to sell out. Mike Cole is looking for an event the night before for out-of-town guests. He is also looking into an alternative activity for Saturday night. Mike would like to change the name to the Denny F. Memorial covered Bridge Cruise.

FordTober Fest is at Maguire's Ford-Lincoln in Palmyra. If the weather is rainy, Joey will make the call for a rain date on Saturday. Max will be leaving Sizzle-N-Chill at 9:30.

Next year, the Club will have both a January and February General meeting on Saturday at Giant so there will not be a separate Planning meeting. Some 2019 planning items will be covered in the General Meetings.

On December 2, The Club will again be holding the Hershey Sweet Lights Trolley. This year the slots are limited so members must sign up in advance and cannot be accommodated the day of.
