1. **Call to Order**

President Max Remington called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance and began Round Table introductions.

2. **Approval of Minutes of March 15, 2018**

Max announced the minutes from the March 15, 2018, meeting were posted on the Club website for review and called for their approval.

It was **MOVED** by Bill Schiel, seconded by Stan VanSickle and carried that the minutes be approved as presented.

3. **Treasurer's Report**

Jen Gamber presented the Treasurer's Report, hard copies of which were available for all present at the meeting. She reviewed the changes to the report since the last meeting. Jen noted the Club's account balance is higher than at the same point last year.

It was **MOVED** by Ira Bloom, seconded by Cathy Klunk and carried that the Treasurer's Report be approved as presented.

4. **Membership Report**

Jen continued with the Membership Report. She noted hard copies were available for review by those present at the meeting and the report was also posted on the Club website. Jen stated the club currently has 277 members, with 141 yet to renew. Max asked any members not receiving the weekly newsletter to email him so they can be added to the mailing list.

5. **President's Report**

Max reported that the Club had two events the previous weekend to celebrate Mustang Day. He thanked Andy Bingham for hosting the Gettysburg cruise and Mike Cole for leading the cruise to Grumpy's BBQ. Max added that some members also visited the AACA Museum on April 17th.

Max reminded everyone that volunteers are needed to help organize meet ups for shows as well as to take pictures for Facebook and the MCCPA website. He added that the Contact page on the website goes directly to him in case anyone wants to contact him and cannot remember his email address. The members page username is MCCPA^members and the password is PonyFun2016!

6. Old Business

Max noted that help is still needed for the Property Management and Show Management positions.

Max reminded members that Carlisle Events is providing a 10% discount for Ford Nationals and other events through April 30. Members registering for the Ford Nationals should select MCCPA as the Club. The Club needs 100 members registered to get the largest tent for free. As of 4/12, 56 members had signed up.

Max stated that volunteers are also needed to help manage the tent at Ford Nationals. Horners will be catering lunch again. The cost will be \$10 per person and the deadline to sign up is May 19. Anyone interested in attending can contact Jen.

7. New Business

Max reminded everyone that the next Planning Meeting is on Saturday, April 28, at 1 pm at the York Motorcycle Club. At the meeting, the Club will be finalizing plans for Muscle Mayhem and preparing for the Dillsburg Lions Club show and Ford Nationals.

Next, Max stated MCCPA will continue to use Twisted-T as its apparel supplier. A schedule will be set up for orders in 2018 and a link to the website is on the members' page. MCCPA also has an L.L. Bean direct business account.

Paul is looking into ordering an MCCPA keychain for the big giveaway at Ford Nationals. The keychain will also be in a goodie bag for anyone who helps. Paul is also getting pricing on MCCPA plastic tumblers. The Club is also going to order a few more 5-6 foot banners for members to use at events.

Max reported that the Club has received 12 donations and four trophy sponsorships for Round Up to date.

8. Cruises/Shows/Other Events

- **Planning Meetings** - Max advised that the May 27 planning meeting conflicts with the popular Chester County Mustang show and will need to be rescheduled. The Club will look for other dates at the planning meeting on April 28. Goodie bags for Round Up will be assembled at the August 26 planning meeting.
- **MCCPA Picnic** - The Club picnic will be on June 30, beginning at the AACA museum and ending at Peg and Sunny Gamber's house again this year.
- **Morgantown Cruise In** - Mike Cole informed the members of a cruise held every Wednesday night from 4-8 pm in Morgantown in the old mall right off the Turnpike. Max asked anyone interested to contact him or Chuck and they will schedule a date to cruise in as a group.
- **Hunt Valley Horsepower** - Max is leading this event on May 19 at the Hunt Valley Towne Centre from 8-10 am. The meet up will be in the Walmart parking lot by Subway in Shrewsbury. Max noted the Cruisin' to Grant Wishes show at New Chester UCC in New Oxford is the same day. Members agreed there was little interest in the New Oxford show so the Club will cruise to Hunt Valley cruise as scheduled that day.
