1. **Call to Order**

President Max Remington called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance and began Round Table introductions.

2. **Approval of Minutes of April 19, 2018**

Max announced the minutes from the April 19, 2018, meeting were posted on the Club website for review and called for their approval.

It was **MOVED** by Dale Warner, seconded by Barb Bloom and carried that the minutes be approved as presented.

3. **Treasurer's Report**

Jen Gamber presented the Treasurer's Report, hard copies of which were available for all present at the meeting. She noted the Club has purchased keychains, cups, notepads, banners and wristbands. Jen also reviewed the financial results from Muscle Car Mayhem, which yielded a \$290 profit.

It was **MOVED** by Barry Klunk, seconded by Gene Wiehagen and carried that the Treasurer's Report be approved as presented.

4. **Membership Report**

Jen continued with the Membership Report. She noted hard copies were available for review by those present at the meeting and the report was also posted on the Club website. Jen stated the club currently has 282 members, with 134 yet to renew. She noted final renewal letters will be sent after Ford Nationals and anyone who does not renew will be removed from the membership roster.

5. President's Report

Max stated that Muscle Car Mayhem had a good turnout, despite the weather.

Max reported that the Club has over 100 members registered for Ford Nationals and will get the large tent for free. He added that John Clor, Enthusiast Communications Manager, Ford Performance, will be visiting the tent on Friday. Max is also working on arranging him to attend another Club event this year.

Max noted the Club won the best club award at the Camaro show. The Camaro Club is interested in doing a joint Camaro/Mustang show with us.

Max reminded everyone that volunteers are still needed to help organize meet ups for shows as well as to take pictures for Facebook and the MCCPA website. Signups are currently being held for the Dillsburg Lions Club show and Ford Nationals.

Max added that members looking to contact him should email or call. The Contact page on the website goes directly to his email. He asked that members not send messages by Facebook as he does not check it frequently. The members page username is MCCPA^members and the password is PonyFun2016!

6. Old Business

Max noted that help is still needed for the Property Management and Show Management positions.

As previously noted, help is needed for registration, parking and voting tabulation for the Dillsburg Lions Club show. Set up time is 7:00 a.m. The volunteers were as follows:

Continuing, Max stated MCCPA will continue to use Twisted-T as its apparel supplier. MCCPA also has an L.L. Bean direct business account. Paul reported that the link will be open through the end of the year, with three production dates. Items can be shipped to members' homes or picked up at Twisted-T.

Max reiterated that volunteers are also needed to help manage new member sign ups at the front of the tent at Ford Nationals. There will be no smoking or vaping in or by the tent. Max stated that all volunteers at Ford nationals will get a special gift bag including a keychain, cup, magnetic clip and note pad. The keychain will also be sold after Ford Nationals for \$10 each. Keychains will also be given to new members after the mugs are gone.

For Ford Nationals, Horner's BBQ will be catering lunch again. The cost is \$10 per person, \$5 for kids 10 and under. The deadline to sign up is May 19. Anyone interested in lunch should see Jen after the meeting or email her. Paul added that lunch will be \$15 on Saturday for those that have not signed up. New members get one free lunch ticket and can purchase additional tickets for \$10 for other family members. Max noted

that members will be setting up at 10 a.m. on Thursday and will be there on Friday by 7 a.m.

7. New Business

Max reported that the Club has received several donations and trophy sponsorships for Round Up. Preregistration is open on the website. Jeff Turicik reviewed the list of 16 donations received to date.

Max and Bill will be attending the CPAVTS presentation night on Tuesday, May 22, at Christian Life Assembly to present the scholarship check to CPAVTS student Andrew as he was not able to attend the car show.

A and A Auto is offering a free exhaust to GTs 2012 and up at Carlisle. Max explained that you do not get to pick the brand but get to keep the original exhaust. The car will remain with A and A Auto all weekend.

Lisa Leathery had asked about the Club attending the July 7 SAAC event at the Farm Show. Max will be getting more information.

Max was also contacted by David Morton from the Mecum Harrisburg 2018 auction taking place at the Farm Show on August 2-4. Mecum has a car club program and will be sending flyers and providing Max with more information.

For Round Up, Bootleg Creamery will be there. Codee Cook had inquired about selling Jax Wax car care products but Max declined due to our relationship with SNSCROFTGATE

The Susquehanna Valley Camaro Club has inquired about co-hosting a Camaro vs. Mustang care show at the Ceramic Pro Auto Spa in Lancaster. Chryslers may also be invited. The show will be on a Sunday, likely September 30th.

Paul added that someone at Mayhem had asked about someone driving his daughter Shelby on a short parade route for her wedding on June 30, which is the same day as the picnic. He emailed Paul and also gave Stan his phone number.

8. Cruises/Shows/Other Events

- **2018 Events** – Dates for most 2018 MCCPA events have been confirmed. Any members with a confirmed date for a show or event should contact Chuck Sennett.
- **AACA Mustang Display** – Several MCCPA members will have cars on display at the AACA museum. The display opening is Friday, May 18. AACA members get free admission. Non-members can purchase tickets online for \$15. The Club will also be visiting the museum before the Club picnic on June 30.
- **Hunt Valley Horsepower** - Max is leading this event on May 19 at the Hunt Valley Towne Centre from 8-10 am. The meet up will be in the Walmart parking lot by Subway in Shrewsbury. After Hunt Valley, the Club will cruise to the 2018 Gold Star Mothers car show in York from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. In the event of bad weather, Max will email those who have signed up. The rain date for the Gold Star Mothers show is

the next day. Also on May 19 are the Cruisin to Grant Wishes at New Chester UCC in New Oxford and the Real Steel Car Show To Benefit Children's Miracle Network in East Berlin, 9-2pm. May 20 is the Hempfield Cops and Robbers show in Manchester, MD.

- **Chester County Mustang** – The preregistration for this show on May 27 closes today. The Club will be meeting at the first rest stop on I-76 east of I-83 and will depart from the Highspire Service Plaza on the PA Turnpike eastbound (Milepost 249.7) at 7:30am. There is a \$100 prize for best club.
- **LCBC** – The show on June 9 is free but pre-registration is recommended. The Club will likely have two meet-ups at Sheetz in Harrisburg and a gas station in Kimberton. Max asked someone to volunteer to lead those areas. If no volunteers, the Sheetz meet-up will be cancelled.
- **MCCPA Picnic** - The Club picnic will be on June 30, beginning at the AACA museum and ending at Peg and Sunny Gamber's house. Admission to the museum is \$12. Members will meet at AACA at 1:30 and Ira and Barb Bloom will lead a cruise from the museum at 3:30, arriving at the Gambers' at 4 p.m. Peggy has the sign-up sheet for food. Members can drop off food before going to the museum.
- **Morgantown Cruise In** - Mike Cole informed the members of a cruise held every Wednesday night from 4-8 pm in Morgantown in the old mall right off the Turnpike. Max asked anyone interested to contact him or Chuck and they will schedule a date to cruise in as a group.
- **Blue Moon Cruisers Dance** – The dance is on May 19, doors open at 6:00 p.m., \$20 admission.

Bill Schiel suggested condensing Muscle Car Mayhem next year to 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. or 1 p.m. with the last trophy given out at that time.

Barry Klunk suggested waiting until June next year to start the Sizzle-N-Chill cruise-ins due to wet weather in the spring.
