1. **Call to Order**

President Max Remington called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance and began Round Table introductions.

2. **Approval of Minutes of June 21, 2018**

Max announced the minutes from the June 21, 2018, meeting were posted on the Club website for review and called for their approval.

It was **MOVED** by Bill Schiel, seconded by Lorraine Turicik and carried that the minutes be approved as presented.

3. **Treasurer's Report**

Jen Gamber presented the Treasurer's Report, hard copies of which were available for all present at the meeting. She noted the Club paid the deposit to keep the Twisted-T link open year-round for ordering of Cub apparel. Income for the month included membership renewals and pre-registrations for the Covered Bridge Cruise.

It was **MOVED** by Ira Bloom, seconded by Carlene Warner and carried that the Treasurer's Report be approved as presented.

4. **Membership Report**

Jen continued with the Membership Report. She noted hard copies were available for review by those present at the meeting and the report was also posted on the Club website. Jen stated the club currently has 304 members, with 94 yet to renew. She noted anyone not renewed by August 1 would be removed from the membership roster.

5. President's Report

Max reported that since the last meeting, the Club ran the Leg Up Farm show and held the Club picnic. Max thanked Barb and Ira Bloom for leading the cruise from the AACA museum to the picnic, Sunny and Peggy Gamber for hosting, and Barry and Kathy for leading the latest Sizzle-N-Chill event.

Max noted the main focus is now on Round Up, including finding trophy sponsors and signing up volunteers to help with the show.

As at previous meetings, Max stated that members looking to contact him should email or call. The Contact page on the website goes directly to his email. He asked that members not send messages by Facebook as he does not check it frequently. The members page username is MCCPA^members and the password is PonyFun2016!

Max reminded everyone that volunteers are still needed to help organize meet ups for shows as well as to take pictures for Facebook and the MCCPA website.

6. Old Business

Max continued with the following updates:

- **2019 MCCPA officers** - Paul Bellis has reached his term limit of four years as per the Bylaws and cannot run for Vice President next year. Max has served two years as President and three years as Vice President. He will be stepping down but will continue to run the website. Members are needed to fill the positions.
- **MCCPA Merchandise** - MCCPA will continue to use Twisted-T as its apparel supplier. The Club has paid a fee to keep the link open all year. MCCPA also has an L.L. Bean direct business account. The Club has new merchandise which Max will be bringing to meetings and certain events. Keychains are \$10, cups \$4, magnetic clips \$1 and notepad and pens are free. Anyone with interest should see Max before or after a meeting.
- **Mustang Round Up and Ford Show**
 - The show is less than 45 days away. Max reported that the Club has received donations and trophy sponsorships for Round Up, but more sponsorships are needed. Sixteen baskets have been prepared to date. Round Up is now an all Ford event. Mustang Round Up and Ford flyers are available.
 - Current vendors for Round Up are: SNSCROFTGATE, Bootleg Creamery and Doug Philips of "what an impression." Horners BBQ will be selling breakfast and lunch. Max is also looking into getting a Ford merchandise truck.
 - At the Planning Meeting on Sunday, August 26 from 1-4 pm at the York Motorcycle Club, members will be putting together goodie bags and going over final details.
 - The Club will be having a Hot Wheels challenge at Round Up and will need a member to provide the track.

- The Club is talking to Stang Magazine about doing an edition of the magazine for Round Up. Paul has ordered a paper copy of the American Muscle edition of the magazine so members can see the print quality. Stang Magazine is also leading Haar's Drive-in night and the Cruise to the NJ Battleship.

7. New Business

Max reported that representatives from Stang Magazine and the AACA Museum have asked to speak at a future MCCPA meeting. The Board decided to allow a non-member speaker to have 15 minutes after the President's Report and the speaker will exit before proceeding with the rest of the meeting. Speakers must be pre-approved by the Board.

Dates for the 2019 monthly general meetings at Giant are being submitted tonight.

MCCPA and Mike Cole announced the signup for the 2018 Covered Bridge Tour to be held on Sunday, October 28, 2018. Registration is now open to MCCPA members. Member can sign up on the website or by paper registration form. Pre-registration must be completed and paid by August 19, 2018. After that, the remaining slots will be offered to the public. To date, 41 of the 100 slots are filled.

MCCPA, Susquehanna Valley Camaro Club and Modern Mopar Club are co-hosting the Detroit Steel Show at Ceramic Pro Auto Spa in Lancaster on September 8 from 1-5 pm. Any Ford, GM or Chryslers made domestically are eligible. Registration is \$15, day of the show only. The event will include a mobile dyno unit, 50/50 and door prizes. Scoops food truck will be onsite. All proceeds will be divided equally between the clubs' charities. Mike from Mopar will be handling the trophies. Three cars will be displayed inside the Auto Spa. Anyone interested in displaying their car inside should contact Max.

MCCPA will be holding its annual trip to Knoebels on July 28, weather permitting. The meet up at 10 am at the Walmart in Selinsgrove at 980 N. Susquehanna Trail. The group will leave at 10:30 with a 30-40 minute ride to the park opening at 11. Mustangs are optional. A discount ride ticket voucher can be purchased at Weis for \$16 and redeemed at the park for a \$20 book of ride tickets. The Club will have its traditional chicken and waffles dinner at the Alamo at 4 pm.

On the same day as Knoebels, there is a show at the Advanced Auto in Shrewsbury for the local swim team as well as the Taste of Mount Joy-Cruisin' Cuisine from 11 am-2:30 pm.
